

# Fresh Scents, Local Roots: Blooming Fields Lavender Farm Prepares for Summer Blooms

**[Athol, ID — May 28, 2026]** — As North Idaho transitions into summer, Blooming Fields Lavender Farm is welcoming visitors back to the farm for another season of lavender blooms, guided tours, greenhouse plant starts, and handcrafted lavender products. Located in Athol, the family-run farm is home to more than 3,000 lavender plants of 13 distinct varieties.

Blooms are expected in July, when guests can visit to see the fields filled with color and fragrance, or sign up for the farm's popular u-pick experience. Outside of July, guests can still explore the farm store, enjoy guided tours of the property, and immerse themselves in the peaceful atmosphere of the lavender fields from May through September.

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## Plan Your Day in the Fields

Whether visitors are looking for a peaceful afternoon surrounded by lavender blooms or a memorable group outing, Blooming Fields Lavender Farm offers experiences throughout the season for all ages.

Beginning in early July, guests can stroll through rows of blooming lavender and participate in the farm's popular u-pick experience, harvesting their own fresh lavender bundles from more than 13 varieties grown on-site. The fields offer a picturesque setting for summer photos, relaxing walks, and a chance to experience the fragrance and beauty of lavender at peak bloom.

From May through September, Blooming Fields offers guided farm tours by appointment. Tours give visitors a behind-the-scenes look at the entire lavender process — from propagation and cultivation to harvesting, distillation, and small-batch product creation. Guests can tour the lavender fields, greenhouse, and copper distillation equipment while learning how lavender is transformed into essential oils and handcrafted products made directly on-site. Farm tours are a popular activity for families, homeschool groups, school field trips, church groups, garden clubs, and professional organizations.

Tours and u-pick experiences are available by appointment, with tickets and additional information available on the farm website.

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## Full Circle: Everything Grown & Made On-Site

"We love giving people the opportunity to see how everything comes together," said Stacey, one of the owners of Blooming Fields Lavender Farm. "From the plants growing in the fields to the essential oil distillation and the finished products, everything happens right here on the farm."

Visitors can also browse the on-site farm store, which features premium lavender products handcrafted on the farm using simple formulations and essential oils distilled from the farm's own plants. Offerings include bath and body products, culinary lavender items, essential oils, seasonal gifts, and other small-batch goods.

Earlier in the season, the farm also offers greenhouse-grown lavender plant starts propagated from mature plants already acclimated to the local climate. These young plants have become increasingly popular with local gardeners looking to grow lavender successfully in their own landscapes.

Operating Tuesday through Sunday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., Blooming Fields Lavender Farm invites both locals and visitors to slow down, experience the beauty of the fields, and enjoy a glimpse into small-scale farm life in North Idaho.

Blooming Fields Lavender Farm is a small family-run lavender farm started in 2019 by Stacey and Nitin Aggarwal, and is home to more than 3,000 lavender plants.
